ACTIVITY NOTES

1. Divide the class into two teams.
2. Have one student from each team come to the front of the class and randomly choose one card each.
3. The first student to write a grammatically correct sentence (using a *tag question*) – without spelling mistakes – is awarded one point for their team.
4. The game continues as the remaining students take turns to come to the board.

CONSIDER

Consider allowing the seated classmates shouting aloud help to their teammates at the board.

Consider setting a minimum number of words per sentence (at least five; more words for a more challenging game)

CONSIDER cont'd

and
