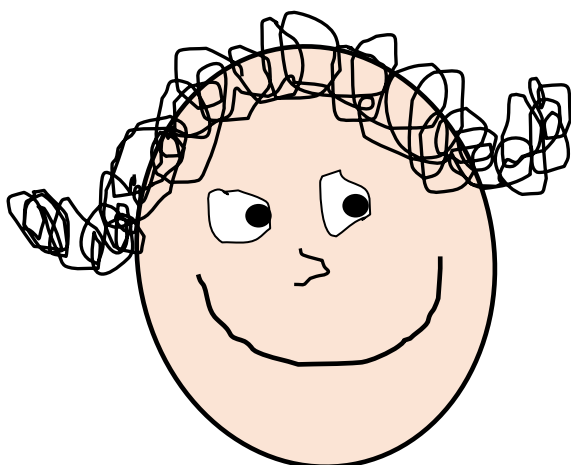
## Future with 'Going To' and 'Will'

**Aims** Writing practice (with future 'going to' and 'will'); reading and speaking practice (with the guessing game)

**Level** Beginner to Elementary

### ACTIVITY NOTES

- This simple worksheet is a great follow up to the "Read-Aloud-And-Listen" activity. Alternatively, it can act as a 'stand-alone' activity.
- Consider using this worksheet as the centerpiece for a guessing game activity:
  1. Ask your learners to leave the 'name' space (at the top of the page) blank.
  2. Give your learners a set time (for example 15 minutes) to write a short paragraph about their plans for next weekend. Tell them not to show their classmates.
  3. Collect the papers and tape them to the walls around the classroom in random order.
  4. Ask your students to stand up and read the worksheets. Let them try to guess who the worksheets belong to.
  5. After the activity, collect the papers, correct them and return them to your students in the next class.



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
