## Statements

- 'have got' and 'have' are used for possession (but 'have got' is more common in British English than in American English).



### *have got*

#### Positive Statement

I You We They	<b>have</b>	<b>got</b>	a red car.
He She It	<b>has</b>		

### *have*

#### Positive Statement

I You We They	<b>have</b>	a red car.
He She It	<b>has</b>	

#### Negative Statement

I You We They	<b>haven't</b>	<b>got</b>	a red car.
He She It	<b>hasn't</b>		

#### Negative Statement

I You We They	<b>don't</b>	<b>have</b>	a red car.
He She It	<b>doesn't</b>
